### Grant Description:


The HLMP (Hurricane Loss Mitigation Program) grant is a state-funded grant program in Florida aimed at reducing the impact of hurricanes by strengthening communities against wind and flood damage. It focuses on retrofitting buildings to meet or exceed current building codes and hurricane standards. The Fire & Rescue Department intends on replacing the four apparatus bay doors and five exterior doors at Fire Station #57 that are original to the 25-year-old building and do not have a wind or impact rating. There is no City Match required.

### Benefit(s) of Grant to City/Department:

Upgrading Fire Station #57 Bay Doors and Exterior Doors would ensure the station is 100% hurricane-ready and eliminate time-consuming preparations, allowing uninterrupted emergency response during severe weather and preserving response times when they're needed the most. Additionally, new impact rated bay doors will enhance protecting high value assets as firefighting apparatus and equipment are expensive and essential to the community. These doors will prevent wind and debris damage, while also keeping First Responders safe during storms and reducing injury risk and liability. Ultimately this will increase the likeness of reduced insurance premiums for the fire station that is fully equipped with hurricane rated features (Roof & Windows) and preserve the structural integrity of the overall building. Securing this grant to replace the apparatus bay doors and exterior doors with hurricane/impact-rated replacements is critical for Edgewater Fire Rescue. Fortifying a public safety structure illustrates preparedness, public confidence and fiscal responsibility to tax paying citizens.
