



Edgewater Wings — Teacher Guidelines

What is this project?

Edgewater Wings is a community art project for the Butterfly Garden at Hawks Park. Student-designed butterfly wings will help inspire a public wing mural where people can stand for fun photo opportunities.

What students should do (quick instructions):

1. Fill out the top section (name, grade, age, date, class/teacher).
2. Draw butterfly wings in the big box using bold, clear designs.
3. Submit Design back to the City of Edgewater by Monday, April 13, 2026 and the winner will be announced at our Earth Day Celebration on Saturday, April 25, 2026. You can drop it off at City Hall, submit by email to: parks@cityofedgewater.org or you can request a class pick up by emailing parks@cityofedgewater.org.

Best design tips for the mural:

- Keep designs **simple + bold** so they're easy to see from far away. Big shapes and patterns (dots, stripes, swirls, hearts, flowers, etc.)
- Fill the space (no tiny drawings!)
- High contrast looks best (dark lines + strong patterns)
- Balanced wings (left + right can match or be creative!)

Why we're doing this:

This mural is meant to celebrate student creativity, community pride, and the beauty of butterflies and nature in the City of Edgewater.

How the artwork will be used:

Student wings will be reviewed and may be used to help create the final mural design. Every submission helps make this a true community project.

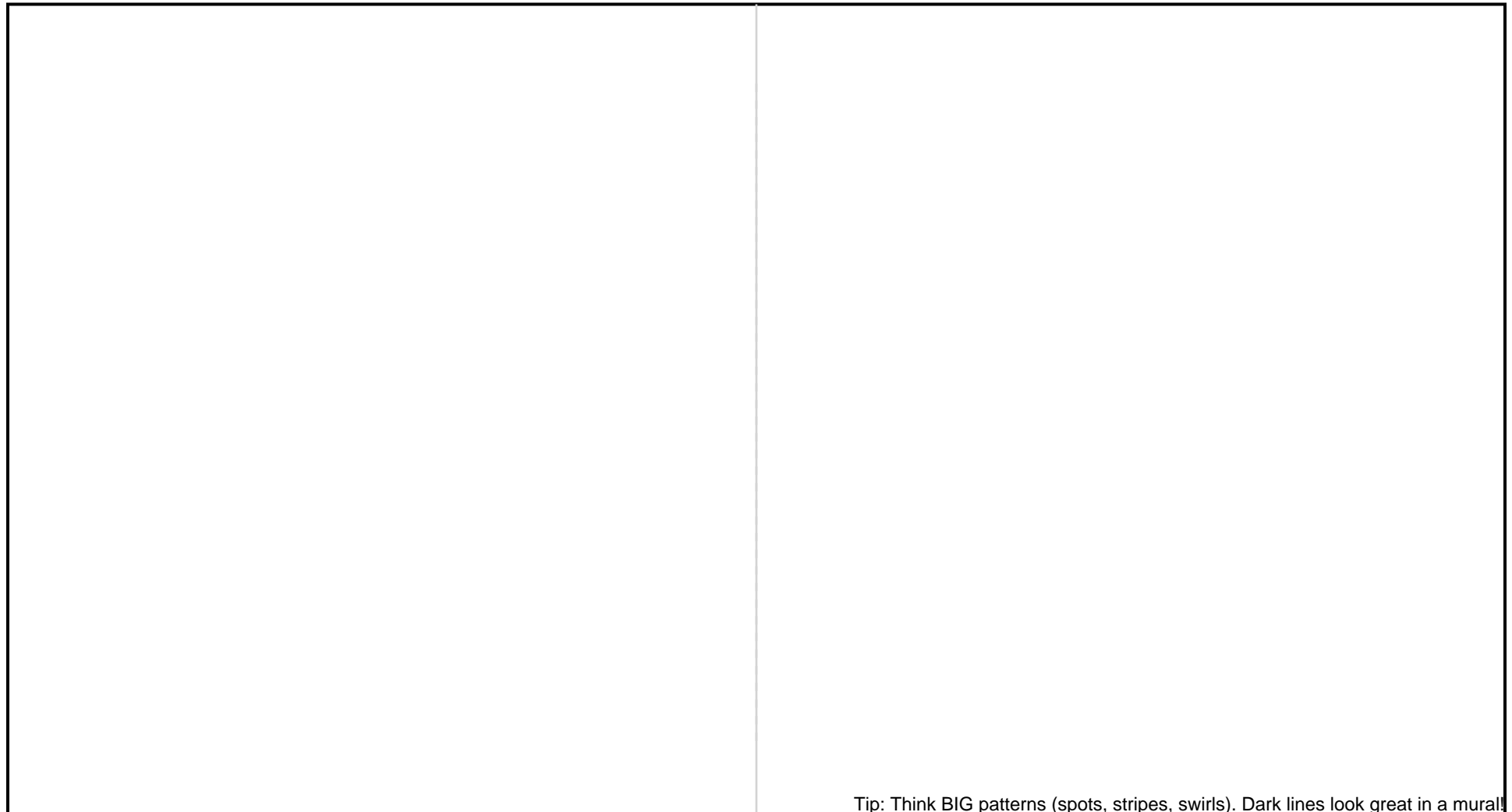
